"A HOME OF OUR OWN"

Following successful negotiations between Fingal County Council and Castleknock Hurling and Football Club, agreement has been reached whereby a long term lease agreement has been entered into in respect of prime amenity lands at Somerton, Castleknock, adjacent to the Castleknock Hotel & Country Club. Following initial approval by the Castleknock/Mulhuddart Area Committee meeting on 5th January 2006, the proposal was put before a full meeting of Fingal County Council held on Monday 9th January and was unanimously approved.

This positive outcome is the result of six years endeavour by a very pro-active committee with the close co-operation of all local elected public representatives. The decision to give the "green light" to Castleknock Hurling & Football Club is a hugely significant milestone in the development of the Club and duly recognises the important role the Club plays in the sporting and recreational life of the Dublin 15 community.

The Executive & members of Castleknock Hurling & Football Club are deeply appreciative of the collective efforts and support of the members of Fingal County Council and in particular County Manager, John Tierney and Director of Services for Community Parks and Recreation, Senan Turnbull.

The Club's immediate priority will be to proceed with the development of much-needed playing pitches on the designated site and plans have already been submitted to Fingal County Council outlining the Club's proposals in this regard. Whilst Fingal County Council have made a multi-million euro investment in acquiring the amenity designated lands, the Club intend investing a comparable figure in bringing the project to fruition over the coming years. This is both an exciting and challenging time for Castleknock Hurling & Football Club and we look forward to bringing the project to fruition in the years ahead.
