CLUB FACILITIES URGENTLY REQUIRED – WE NEED YOUR HELP

As our members are aware, Castleknock Hurling and Football Club has rapidly grown since its birth 6 years ago in 1998. Our Grounds Committee have been working tirelessly for the last five years, with the assistance of the County Manager, to secure adequate facilities for our members.

At a recent meeting of Fingal County Council, the Fingal County Manager's proposal was narrowly defeated: 11 votes to 10 by the County Councillors. The Fingal Manager's proposal would have incorporated lands for sporting clubs, community facilities and green open space in addition to housing, in proximity to the existing rail network, which was sympathetic to national policy guidelines.

As a consequence of this vote, Fingal County Council has no land to offer any sporting organisations in our area including Castleknock Hurling and Football Club. We now have a membership of over 800! The vast majority of our members are juveniles – 600 in total. Our children need a home to call their own. This need is urgent. Take for example all our young boys and girls who don't have access to a toilet, let alone access to adequate changing rooms as the Club currently stands.

Notwithstanding the difficulties that the lack of a home of our own creates we have had some fantastic achievements both on and off the field. Our greatest achievement is arguably providing sport and recreation facilities to over 800 children and adults. The positive influence of sporting activities on our children is very well documented, not forgetting the positive benefit that the Club has on the social cohesion of the Community.

Why we urgently need a home of our own:

- Growth in membership: 2002 - 275; 2003 – 550; 2004 – 800 and growing.
- To continue providing access to sporting activities for both the boys and girls and men and women of the area
- No toilet facilities - it is not acceptable for teenage girls in particular
- 14 rented venues needed for winter training spread all over the Dublin 15
- We regularly have to concede home advantage in competitive fixtures
- Our youth is the future of our community – they need a home in their local area



Some of our recent on-field achievements include:

- Our U14 Ladies are the current Dublin Champions who will represent the County in the National Féile Finals this Summer in Tyrone
- Our Adult County Champion Junior Hurlers
- 8 juvenile members on Dublin County teams,
- 6 of our young players compete for Dublin Ladies at U-14 and U-16 level, both teams are in All-Ireland Semi Finals
- One of our members is on the Dublin Senior Ladies Football Panel
- League wins and tournament wins in numerous under-age groups

- Raising over €56,000 in aid of the St. Francis Hospice – thanks to our extensive support
- Providing coaches to our local schools
- Social activities for our members and friends

What we need? We need facilities of our own to cater for our needs. Over 800 people have voted with their feet and joined our Club because of the services we provide to our Community.

What you can do? We will not let this setback divert us from our objective of securing adequate facilities to which we are entitled. We ask you to raise the issue of when adequate facilities will be provided for our Club with election candidates during the current election campaign.

We would ask you to do this in a positive and constructive manner, and judge for yourself what each candidate will specifically do.

As Castleknock Hurling & Football Club continues to flourish with the sustained support and goodwill of the wider community, we are encouraged by the level of public support for the positive and constructive work for the youth within our community. We remain confident that our public representatives will listen to our needs and respond in both a meaningful and constructive manner.

Castleknock 'B's bowed out of the D Championship to Templeogue/Synge St in a tight match in Porterstown on Thursday 20th May last. A strong team took the pitch in front of a sizeable home crowd on a perfect night for football.

Mickey Harte & Sam Maguire visit Castleknock



On Saturday morning, 15 May 2004, Mickey Harte and Sam Maguire arrived in Tír na nÓg to a rapturous reception. The large attendance of members of the club were delighted to hold and have photos taken with Sam Maguire and to meet and hear Mickey Harte. His speech was an inspiration to anyone who heard it. Below is a verbatim account of some of that speech.

"I think it's brilliant to see your Club and what you've done here in such a short time. There is nothing like the GAA to give a good start in life to all our young people and to have adults like you have around here, who are so enthusiastic and so helpful - it's brilliant."

He continued "I think the young people would do well to recognise that, because people could go and sit in their own houses and live their lives and enjoy themselves but they don't, they give up time to be with you, to develop you, not only as good sportspeople but as good young people for life and I think that we owe a lot to the GAA for that and to see so many people from so many different counties here deciding to give of their best for the GAA, that is just super. It's a privilege for all of us to be associated with the GAA and that's the way I look at it. I'm delighted to be here this morning, it's a real gift to have the opportunity to be here so it's not a difficult thing to do."

Here's Mickey's response to a question by John Todd about success: "There's only a few winners if you're talking about cups only but the winners are the people who participate in our games, the people who organise them, the parents who give support to kids to go out and do it. That's success because there's no other organisation, no other group of people that have such affinity with each other like the people in the GAA and it's very evident here. There are people from all parts of the country and they all come in here and what's their key focus and key association - the GAA and their young people and it's just fantastic."

Castleknock's U11 Boys win Division 1 Cup



Castleknock and Raheny supporters left Erin's Isle grounds on Sunday evening having witnessed one of the best games of Gaelic football that is likely to be played this year. In a high scoring game that went right to the wire, Castleknock's young cubs tamed the Raheny lions to win the inaugural U11 Division 1 Gaelic football Cup.

Team manager, Gerry Cadden, gave a few passionate words of encouragement to the Castleknock lads before the match. The words seemed to work a treat as the team, lead out by captain Eoin Conway, were really fired up as they ran out onto the pitch. A big crowd of supporters had travelled from Castleknock to see if the boys in their new club attire could deliver another big win.

From the throw-in, Castleknock, playing with a strong breeze, dominated midfield (Kieran Kilkenny and John "Man-of-the-Match" Conroy) and sent some great ball into the full forward line where Fintan "Vinny Murphy" Browne (dad Gerry, who was umpire, was beaming with pride) scored two early points. The two corner forwards, Jack Kiernan and Gerry Cadden, had their markers at "sixes and sevens" as Castleknock continued to bombard the Raheny goal. A great goal from Kieran Kilkenny and some great points from centre forward, John R. O'Donovan, stretched the Castleknock lead before Raheny got a quick goal and a point. Castleknock's forwards lost their scoring boots for the remainder of the first half and a late goal from Raheny meant that Castleknock had only a two point lead at half-time.
